Adult Inpatient Survey (IP24)



This survey seeks feedback on patients' experiences with NHS adult inpatient services. Eligible patients were **aged 16 or older, had stayed at least one night in hospital, and were discharged from an NHS Trust in England, during November 2024.**



Fieldwork ran from January to April 2025, with responses received from 62,444 patients, **resulting in an adjusted response rate of 41%.**

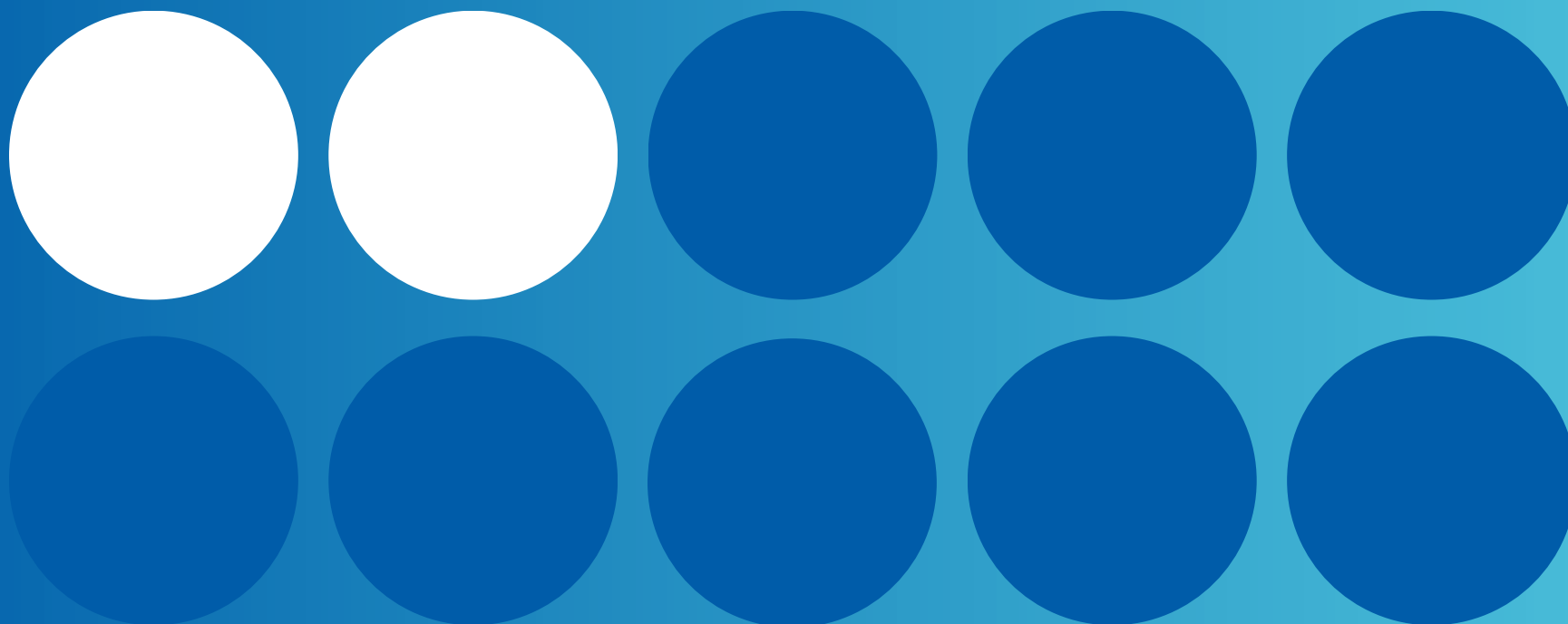


42%
